Message from the Commodore

Can it really be the middle of August? It's hard to believe the Summer is quickly coming to a close and Fall is right around the corner! So many Summer plans and so little time left. Of course, that also means that Labor Day is right around the corner, and all of us at the Ninnescah Sailing Association look forward to Labor Day! More on that in a minute...

I hope you have had the chance to get out to the lake and take advantage of the warm weather this past month. If so, you have no doubt seen a lot of sailing instruction going on. Peyton Adair and his Youth Sailing instructors put on two youth camps this year with 44 students! Not to be outdone, Kathy Evans, Ken Ratlief and their adult instructors have (by the time you read this) put on four Adult learn to sail classes and one Adult Keelboat class. Numbers are up across the board for sailing instruction, and I have heard rumors of a possible third youth class next year! We will address their concerns regarding power to "Hydro Hoists" with those members that are using lifts, and we will request clarification to their concerns surrounding power cords supplying 120 volt power to boats. More on that at a later date.

Now back to Labor Day! We have secured all the necessary licenses and permits, and are under contract with Stellar Fireworks for another of our highly anticipated fireworks shows. Sunday September 5 will be a full day of activities, with sailing, our New Member initiation program featuring none other than King Neptune, Labor Day dinner beginning with a social hour, and capping off the day with the fireworks extravaganza! Have you checked your boat LATELY?

Club rules require that we check our boat and trailer at least every two weeks. If you are already mowing your yard at home, it's a safe bet your yard space needs attention too.

We mow for fire hazard as well as appearance. **Please do not use Roundup or other herbicides**, as they will only kill the grass, create dry areas that will burn easily, and only the weeds will return. During the heavy growth times, for fire safety, it may be necessary to mow more than just once a month.

Yard spaces will be inspected the first Sunday each month. If the growth is heavy, thick or high enough to touch the frame of your trailer, it will be moved for you and you will be billed.

Please take note: Extra reminder notices won't be going out this year. Please be sure to keep air in your tires and your trailer unlocked for easy moving.

Please consider the following:


- Mowers are provided in the sheds in each yard. Please check the oil in the mower before using.

- The only tie downs allowed are those that are set in concrete. The twist in doggie style are mower killers, and do not hold in our Kansas storms. Please report any missing tie downs.
- The yard spaces are for boats and trailers only.


